Serapis Bey is a 7 year old stallion by the straight Egyptian Ansata Ibn Halima grandson, Ansata El Shahraf and out of my Egyptian and Crabbet mare Edin Eve. Eve at that time was the only non straight Egyptian mare he was ever allowed to breed. The only time Serapis was shown was at the Wisconsin Desert Horse Association sport horse show in 2010 where he was shown in the purebred sport horse stallion in hand class.

He won that class against aged stallions as a yearling! Because he was a yearling he was ineligible to show in the Region 10 Championship class. Financial difficulties have kept us from being able to show him since; however, he is now in training with noted dressage breeder, trainer, and judge, Ken Borden of Little Bit Farm in Wilmington, Illinois.

. Besides breeding and training horses for international levels, including the Olympics, Ken is a USDF Gold medalist and has bred, trained, and shown several horses which hold many of the highest scores ever in USDF (United States Dressage Federation) standings. Until he had to take a break from showing this year his horse, Rashka, was the high point I-1 (Intermediare 1) horse. Look for Ken and Serapis in dressage classes next summer





Safe Food Safe Horse March on DC 9-22-16

This year, our march will be dual purpose. We are raising awareness to the world of the loopholes we have in US legislation that allows US equines (horses, donkeys, mules and burros) which are laden with pharmaceuticals, into the global food supply, and a "public hearing" on the wild horses to dispel myths and bring the truth to light. UN Members of CODEX will be attending a food safety meeting at the USDA to discuss veterinary drug residue in the global food supply. We want to make sure they know that the US is responsible for the slaughter pipeline which results in toxic horsemeat around the globe. Congress has made it clear that they want to send all wild horses and burros in holding, and most remaining n the range, to slaughter. The time is NOW to let the UN and Congress know we need to shut down the US horse slaughter pipeline by passing the Safeguard American Food Exports (SAFE) Act S1214/HR1942, and to let Congress know we wont allow our wild horses to go to slaughter. Our government is knowingly contaminating the global food supply.

⌚ Date, Time, Place: September 22, 2016 at 10:00am. The meeting point will be in front of the USDA Whitten Building between 12th and 14th Avenues, Washington, DC 20250-9911. We will march down Independence Ave to the Capitol Building. Directions to USDA Building: <http://bit.ly/1RPP3ep>

⌚ Agenda: We will meet promptly in front of the USDA building and have several well speakers, well known in the wild horse and anti horse slaughter communities. We will rally at the USDA building until after the CODE meeting begins at 1:00pm, and then march to the Capitol Building where we will convene for a rally on the Capitol Grounds, where we will listen to Ginger Kathrens of the Cloud Foundation speak about the plight of our wild horses and burros, an opportunity that wasn't afforded to her at the Natural Resources Committee Hearing on WH&B in June. Additional speakers will be announced shortly.

⌚ Speakers:

Ginger Kathrens, Executive Director of The Cloud Foundation, Emmy Award-winning producer, cinematographer, writer and editor and award-winning author.

⌚ Things To Do: We strongly urge attendees to meet with their congress members the day before and/or the day after the march, Wednesday September 21, 2016 and/or Friday September 23, 2016.

⌚ Who Is CODEX?

The Codex Alimentarius (Latin for "Food Code") is a collection of internationally recognized standards, codes of practice, guidelines, and other recommendations relating to foods, food production, and food safety. Its name is derived from the Codex Alimentarius Austriacus. Its texts are developed and maintained by the Codex Alimentarius Commission, a body that was established in early November 1961 by the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO), was joined by the World Health Organization (WHO) in June 1962, and held its first session in Rome in October 1963. The Commission's main goals are to protect the health of consumers and ensure fair practices in the international food trade. The Codex Alimentarius is recognized by the World Trade Organization as an international reference point for the resolution of disputes concerning food safety and consumer protection.

Horse slaughter is a predatory industry; we do not raise horses in this country for food and as such, medicate them differently from other food animals. Almost every horse in this country has received Phenylbutazone (Bute), which is as ubiquitous in horses as aspirin is in humans. Bute is banned by the FDA from use in any animal intended for human consumption. Race horses are given over 100 different drugs, and many can be found on the FDA NARAD Banned Substance list. These substances are banned from any animal intended for human consumption, because they can cause various illnesses including aplastic anemia (bone marrow failure resulting in the bodies inability to produce blood cells), kidney failure, liver toxicity, and can even cause death. Bute is known as a hypersensitive drug which means no safe dosage for humans can be determined. Currently the USDA does not test for species DNA, they only test for banned substances and certain bacteria.

Public safety in the US and a safe food supply is the responsibility of the US Congress. The only way to protect the food supply from toxic horse meat is to pass the Safeguard American Food Exports (SAFE) Act S. 1214/HR. 1942. Please sign and share the [petition](#) to support of the SAFE Act S. 1214/HR. 1942 to shut down the US horse slaughter pipeline. We're getting close to a simple majority in the House, and need YOUR help to get us all the way there.
